

# How to support us

The *Development for the Future Fund* is supported by voluntary contributions from parents: all funds go directly to enhancing your daughter's experience throughout her time at Newlands.

# Providing the best for your daughter's future

## Lab 20

Lab 20 was completely refurbished, creating a state-of-the-art learning space for our budding scientists.



## Classrooms

Two newly built classrooms, were fully kitted out with projectors, desks, chairs and blinds. These rooms provide much needed additional space for our students to learn in the most effective study environment.



## The Q-Space

We encourage students in all years to develop individual study skills and to build their confidence as independent young women.

The development of our old, disused outdoor quadrangle into the bright, modern Q-Space has been transformational.

# Plans for this year

At Newlands we have continued to thrive despite the budgetary pressures currently faced by all schools. We have effectively managed our budget by controlling costs and improving efficiency. However, our ability to build on the immense progress we have made, and to develop Newlands further as a centre of excellence, is contingent on raising funds ourselves: our plans for development next academic year are expected to cost in the region of £70,000.

## Priorities for 2021-2022: Classroom Renovation



One of our current ambitions is to renovate 29 classrooms to the highest standard possible.

Each classroom requires £2,500 to upgrade the IT infrastructure, equipment and learning environment to a sector-leading standard.

## Minibuses

The leases on our trusty minibuses ended and we now have two new buses (since November 2020), which will cost approximately £10k a year. Used every day, these vehicles are vital for taking girls to sports fixtures, on educational outings and to the consortium schools for Sixth Form learning and enrichment opportunities.
