ADMISSIONS

Applications for places at Newlands on transfer from primary school are dealt with by Achieving for Children on behalf of the Local Authority (Achieving for Children, Admissions Team, Town Hall, St Ives Road, Maidenhead SL6 1RF), Tel: 01628 683870. Parents of girls already attending Windsor & Maidenhead primary schools will receive details of the application process through their daughter's school in the September preceding that for which entry to Year 7 is sought.

Parents of girls currently attending schools in the private sector, who are resident in the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead, should make an application using the online facility via the RBWM website.

Parents of girls who live outside the Borough should contact the Admissions Team of their home authority.

Admission to Year 7 is limited to 192 girls. Last year there were 464 preferences for those places. 192 girls were admitted up to Category 4, (children living in the designated area), to a distance of 1.788 miles.

This year there were 20 appeals lodged for places over the standard number, and two of these were upheld. The outcome of applications and appeals for 2022 places is not necessarily an indication of the position for 2023.
