October is ADHD Awareness Month. ADHD (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder) is not always easy to diagnose. People with ADHD may experience:

- · Concentration issues and trouble focusing
- Difficulty staying organised
- Being forgetful about completing tasks
- Problems sitting still
- Being easily distracted

Symptoms usually start very early in life, before the age of six. We do not know exactly what causes ADHD, but experts think it might run in families, or it could be to do with the way in which chemicals work in the brain. People with ADHD will need others around them to be understanding and patient when they are struggling.
