A new campaign has been launched to raise awareness of 'self-generated' child sexual abuse material.

In the last year, there has been a 77% increase in 'self-generated' sexual abuse content, created on webcams or smartphones and then shared online. The images and videos predominantly involve girls 11-13 years old, made in their bedrooms or another home setting. It has been suggested that the extra time at home during the lockdowns has contributed to this exponential increase.

To help prevent the creation of this type of abusive imagery, a campaign has been launched by the Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) backed by the Home Office and Microsoft. It aims to help raise awareness among parents and carers of young teens about this type of criminality, empower and educate girls aged 11 to 13+ to spot the techniques used by sexual predators and give them the knowledge to '**Block, Report, Tell**' someone they trust.
