Dear Parents and Carers



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To further promote our vision to 'build an ambitious and caring community of people who eagerly contribute to every aspect of school life, whilst instilling the ethos that there are no limits to what can be achieved' we are re-launching our House System and updating our Rewards Policy.

As a school community, we feel passionately that a well-established House and rewards system has innumerable benefits including, but not limited to, instilling our school values: courage, commitment, and compassion.

In response to feedback from parents/carers, we also wish to improve communication and ensure you are kept informed of these rewards. As a result, via your EduLink account/app, you will now be able to view the total number of House Points your child has obtained and be notified when they are awarded House Points, along with the member of staff who awarded them and the reason. If you have not already done so, we would therefore like to strongly encourage that both you and your child have downloaded the EduLink app or can access this via a web browser.

Please note, after the Christmas holidays we will be wiping all previous House Points and starting fresh from January. This will help to ensure that all students have been awarded fairly under the new criteria.

What will they be awarded for?

The newly updated categories for rewarding our students can be found below. *Please note, we are continually reviewing these categories and may find a need to add more as we embed the new system.*
