Johnny Depp and Amber Heard Trial By Afrah Qamar

One major thing that has been in the news recently is the Amber Heard and Johnny Depp defamation trial, in which Depp has taken Heard to court over alleged false accusations, and is suing her for \$50 million.

This conflict started when Heard first publicly accused Depp of domestic violence in May 2016 when, days after filing for divorce, she requested and received a temporary restraining order on the grounds of domestic violence. Depp's lawyer promptly issued a statement saying that Heard was lying, "attempting to secure a premature financial resolution by alleging abuse." There were many things to follow that, including the ongoing trial that has been scheduled for five weeks, but one main topic surrounding this case is the domestic abuse allegation from both parties.

Depp was on the stand a week ago, and he testified to Heard physically abusing him, including an incident where she allegedly cut his finger off. The court was able to hear several recordings of the arguments the couple had when together and, most appalling, Heard actually verbally admitting to hitting Depp.

Heard is currently on the stand herself giving her testimony, but whilst we as the public might not ever know the full truth about their relationship, domestic abuse is a very serious allegation, that will most definitely ruin someone's life forever. It is not something to lie about because this takes away from actual victims of abuse and increases the amount of stigma around victims speaking out and getting help. There are many cases of domestic abuse, increasing each year so it is important we speak out against it, and if you do know anyone you might be in a situation like this, help them to get the support they need.

Loneliness (Taken from The Mental Health Foundation)

Loneliness is the negative feeling we have when the relationships and connections we have with others are not what we want.

Loneliness is something that most of us will feel at some point in our lives, but there are certain factors that put some at a higher risk of loneliness than others.

Full-time students are among those at higher risk of feeling lonely: during the pandemic, 26% of students reported feeling lonely often or always, compared with 8% of the adult population.
Although that figure decreased as restrictions eased (22%), it still remained much higher than loneliness levels in adults (6%). Even before the pandemic, 88% of Britons aged from 18 to 24 said they experience loneliness to some degree, with 24% experiencing it often, and 7% saying they are lonely all of the time.

This '<u>Student Guide to Loneliness</u>' aims to provide young people with support and strategies to overcome loneliness if and when they face it.
