




Revision Advice

Imposter Syndrome

Imposter syndrome refers to an internal experience of believing that you are not as competent as others perceive you to be. While this definition is usually narrowly applied to intelligence and achievement, it has links to perfectionism and the social context.

This can be caused by many things including your family comparing you to other siblings who you feel are more high achieving than you. It has also been linked to issues of self-esteem and depression. Female students have been shown to be particularly prone to imposter syndrome.

Ways to overcome imposter syndrome include identifying which factors are causing it, recognising when limiting thoughts are coming into your head, and talking kindly to yourself. Be proud of yourself and write down the strengths you show, and the things you achieve. Imposter syndrome is very common and very natural: if you experience it then you're not alone. Just remember that your experiences, insight and knowledge are just as valuable as anyone else's.




Eat less meat By Lily Hall
