#### **Christmas Appeal**

The charity exists to help people in and around Maidenhead who are, for whatever reason, unable to feed themselves and their families properly. Christmas can be a particularly difficult time and we would love to make a real difference as a school community by collecting as many food donations as possible before the end of term to deliver to the food bank. Foodshare is also able to accept <u>cash donations</u> if any student or parent would like to support the charity in that way. This is particularly important since these are often the most expensive items for people to buy.


