
Sixth Form Assembly

It was fantastic to be able to host our first face-to-face assembly in the Hall this week, following months of virtual presentations due to COVID restrictions! A huge thanks goes to Mr Wood for a fascinating presentation on the impact that STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) education and careers have on our everyday lives. It was particularly apt that he drew attention to Professor Sarah Gilbert: a professor of vaccinology at Oxford University, who led the development and testing of the universal flu vaccine, which underwent clinical trials in 2011. She also led the team that designed the Oxford–AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine, which has saved more than 100,000 lives in England alone. In the same week that we celebrated International Women's Day, reflecting on the role of women in Science was a timely reminder of the importance of gender equality and empowerment. In an interview, Gilbert said she was saddened to receive a letter from a primary schoolgirl saying she has been inspired by her and other female scientists to believe that she can achieve whatever she wants, despite being a girl. As Mr Wood pointed out, it is because of, not despite, being girls that our students have the passion and drive to go forward and become the game-changing scientists of the future.

International Women's Day is celebrated on the 8<sup>th</sup> March each year. It is a global day to celebrate the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating women's equality and to honour women's significant achievements. Our film recommendation this week is <u>Little Women (U)</u>: director Greta Gerwig draws on both the classic novel and the writings of Louisa May Alcott, and tells the story of the March sisters - four young women each determined to live life on her own terms.


