

The Lumière Film Society



The website is actually really interesting: I had no idea that 5 in 10 young people routinely listen to their music too loudly, to the extent that 48 million people in the U.S. alone have trouble hearing with one, or both, of their ears. In addition to increasing stress-levels and contributing to information over-loading, noise can also cause irrevocable hearing loss, which a growing body of research links with long-term social isolation, depression, and even the onset of Alzheimer's Disease. To reduce the risk of this, the solutions are very simple: try leaving your airpods at home if you're going for a walk, turn down the volume when you're using headphones, and move away from the speakers at concerts. 
