### Memory By Rebecca Anderson

Memory is the part of the brain where information is stored, retrieved and manipulated. There are four different types of memory: sensory memory (holds information from senses such as what you hear or see), short-term memory (a few pieces of information that lasts for 30 seconds such as a string of 5-7 words that you are writing down), working memory (similar to short term memory but this information is manipulated in some way such as debate), and long-term memory (stores a wide range of memories and experiences). Long term memory can be split into two categories - explicit (conscious memories of events and autobiographical facts) and implicit (memories that influence a person's behaviour but people do not consciously think about them). This can also include procedural memory (automatic behaviours that are learned such as driving or reading) and priming memories that influence someone's reactions from previous experiences and events in their life. These different types of memory are worth thinking about when planning your revision for the upcoming exams.
