News In Brief



Holocaust Educational Trust

We are excited to be able to share an opportunity for our Sixth Form students to be able to participate in an online initiative which has been launched by the Holocaust Educational Trust. *Lessons from Auschwitz Online* is available to all state schools and colleges in England with a post-16 provision. Participating students will have access to the new online learning platform to complete self-guided learning modules, and use cutting edge virtual reality technology to view key sites at the Auschwitz-Birkenau State Memorial and Museum. Participants will also hear from a Holocaust survivor who will share their testimony and answer questions. The course will be led by specialist educators who will guide students throughout the project and students will be expected to attend three online Live Sessions.

Spaces are extremely limited so please could any student who is interested in taking part come and see Mrs Bretherton as soon as possible.



The Lumière Film Society

The Holocaust Memorial Day is commemorated on the 27th January each year: groups of committed people and organisations come together to remember and learn in the hope that there may be one day a future where there is no genocide.

Whilst we often think of the Holocaust as the genocide of European Jews in the Second World War, the word refers to any destruction of human life on a mass scale. Our film recommendation this week is In the Land of Blood and Honey (15): a 2011 war drama film written, produced, and directed by Angelina Jolie. The film depicts a love story set against the background of the Bosnian War, which was declared a genocide by the International Court of Justice. Starting in April 1992, Serbia set out to ethnically cleanse Bosnian territory by systematically removing all Bosnian Muslims, known as Bosniaks. Serbia, together with ethnic Bosnian Serbs, attacked Bosniaks with former Yugoslavian military equipment and surrounded Sarajevo, the capital city. Many Bosniaks were driven into concentration camps, where civilians were tortured, starved and murdered.

Following on from the Manchester United player, Mason Greenwood's, sexual assault allegations, it is important to know that there is support for everyone affected by these issues. Rape Crisis England & Wales is a feminist organisation that supports the work of Rape Crisis Centres across England and Wales. They also raise awareness and understanding about sexual violence and abuse in all its forms.

Rape Crisis is the national umbrella body for the network of autonomous member Rape Crisis Centres across England and Wales. They exist to improve services, and promote the needs and rights of women and girls who have experienced sexual abuse, rape and all forms of sexual violence. They also work towards the elimination of sexual violence and abuse, raising awareness in the wider community and with government. There are currently have 39 member Rape Crisis Centres. Rape Crisis supports girls, women, boys, men and non-binary people allowing all sexual trauma to be recognised and treated.

Our most local centre supported by Rape Crisis is Aylesbury Vale & Milton Keynes Sexual Assault & Abuse Support Service (AVMK SAASS).

Tragedy in Morocco Shared by Zoha Qureshi

A 5 year old boy who was trapped in a 32m deep well has died. The child, Rayan Oram, who fell on Tuesday 2nd February, was trapped for four days whilst emergency services were cautiously building tunnels around him trying to reach him. The government officials have said that he died before the rescuers reached him: he was provided with oxygen and water using a rope, however, problems arose as the hole was very narrow and if too large it could have caused the well to collapse. Hundreds of people

from the village of Ighran gathered for his funeral on the 6th February and performed prayers, and mourned for his death. Vast crowds came to offer their support by singing and praying to encourage the rescuers who worked around the clock.

West Ham have stated "we have spoken to Kurt and will be dealing with the matter internally". Essex police have now said they are making "urgent enquiries" about the incident.


