
# US Abortion Laws By Afrah Qamar

Currently in the America, the US Supreme Court is looking to overturn the Roe v. Wade abortion rights decision. This was a landmark decision in which the Court ruled that the Constitution of the United States protects a pregnant woman's (person's) liberty to choose to have an abortion, without excessive government restriction. This took effect in 1973 and the case created the "trimester" system that gives American citizen an absolute right to an abortion in the first three month of pregnancy, allows some government regulation in the second trimester of pregnancy, and declares that states may restrict or ban abortions in the last trimester as the foetus nears the point where it could live outside the womb. Roe v Wade also established that in the final trimester, a person can obtain an abortion despite any legal ban only if doctors certify it is necessary to save their life or health.

If Roe v. Wade is overturned, abortion will not immediately become illegal nationwide: instead, it would be up to each State to decide how much access people living there would have to an abortion. About half of the US states will move to ban abortions within weeks, many immediately. The thirteen States which would likely enforce an immediate ban are: Arkansas, Idaho, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, North Dakota, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah, Texas, Oklahoma, and Wyoming. Other states, however, will continue to provide access, not just for women in their State, but also for those living in States where it will be banned.

It is very important to understand and realise that the number of people having abortions does not change when abortion is outlawed. There are many reasons someone may want to get an abortion, including not having the financial stability, the fact going through with the pregnancy would severely affect the persons physical or mental health, the pregnancy being a result of sexual assault, or any other reason that is just as valid. Whilst some people may be able to travel long distances to get an abortion, others may not be able to afford to, but no doubt people will seek abortion whether its legal or not. The difference will be that many of them of them will be harmed, or even die, as a result of not having access to safe healthcare. Having the choice to get an abortion is not only healthcare, it is a human right and should be treated as such.


things that have a low chance of happening and that you can plan and prepare for; if you are prepared, there is nothing to worry about
