Thinking About English Language A Level?



The idea of a reverse advent calendar is to put the emphasis on giving rather than receiving. An Australian woman, Heather Luttrell, saw the idea online and says it now teaches her children the value of generosity. By beginning with a large box, and placing an item in the box each day rather than taking

something out (e.g. toiletries, food, Christmas treats), by the end of advent you will have a full box ready to be donated to a food relief agency or other similar charity where it can then be given to a family in need. She began the idea in 2018 by simply asking family and friends to join in, ending up with 70 boxes to donate. This Christmas she has taken the initiative nationwide: there will be over 4000 boxes being collected and donated across Australia. Although a bit late now, this could be a really great idea to try to adopt in the UK for Christmas 2022!




UK Asylum Seekers

According to official estimates, asylum applications to the UK have reached their highest level since 2004: there were 37,562 asylum applications this year which was an 18% increase on previous years. Immigration that doesn't include asylum claims or refugees, however, has fallen by 88%. These figures have come after a demand for renewed calls for changes to the way those seeking refuge are treated, after 27 people drowned crossing the channel. As well as that, this year more than 23,000 people have attempted crossing from France to the UK by boat. A Government spokesperson has said that the asylum statistics 'demonstrate the complex scale of the global migration crisis' which has likely increased due to 'arrivals from 'Eritrea, Iran and Syria' and the slow processing of asylum claims.


