**Sixth Form Enrichment** 

Congratulations to our Year 13 students who completed their Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) in November 2021, and who have now been awarded their grades. The EPQ is an independent research project: each student chooses a topic to research that is of interest to them. Students attend one lesson a fortnight throughout Year 12, learning skills related to ethical research and academic report writing. In

addition, students regularly meet together in small groups with a member of staff to discuss their progress. Students complete their project by presenting their findings to a small group of staff and students. Topics are varied and hugely interesting, ranging from Formula 1 cars to selective breeding in dogs. The EPQ is equivalent to half an A-Level and 59% of our students achieved grade A\* or A: well done to all who took part.


#### OCD


OCD (obsessive-compulsive disorder) includes obsessions, urges, or mental images that cause anxiety, for example: the fear of germs or having to make things symmetrical. Compulsions are repetitive behaviours where the person feels the urge to do them in response to an obsessive thought, such as excessively cleaning or ordering and arranging things in a particular way. A person with OCD generally can't control his or her thoughts or behaviours, even when they are recognised as excessive. Nor do they get pleasure when performing the behaviours or rituals, but may feel brief relief from the anxiety the thoughts cause and experience significant problems in their daily life due to these thoughts or behaviours.
