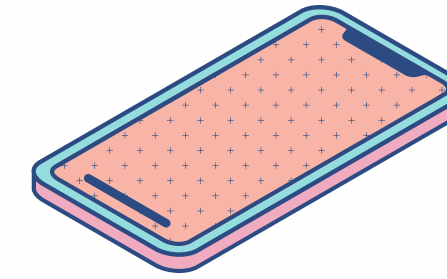
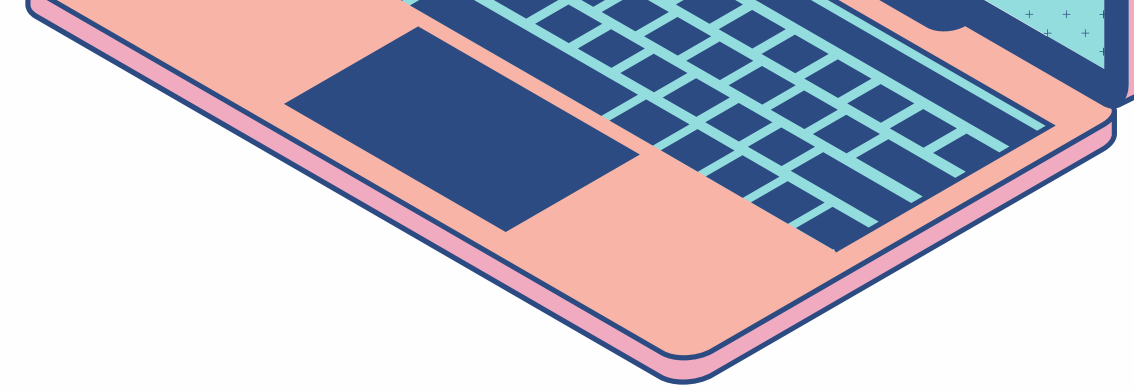
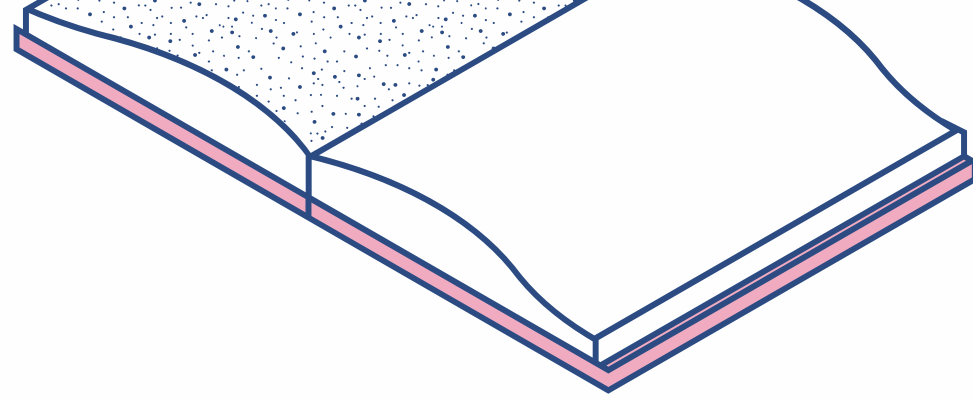

- New Students please ask your Form Tutors, Mrs Bretherton, myself or Ms Le Cuirot if there are any questions that need answering.

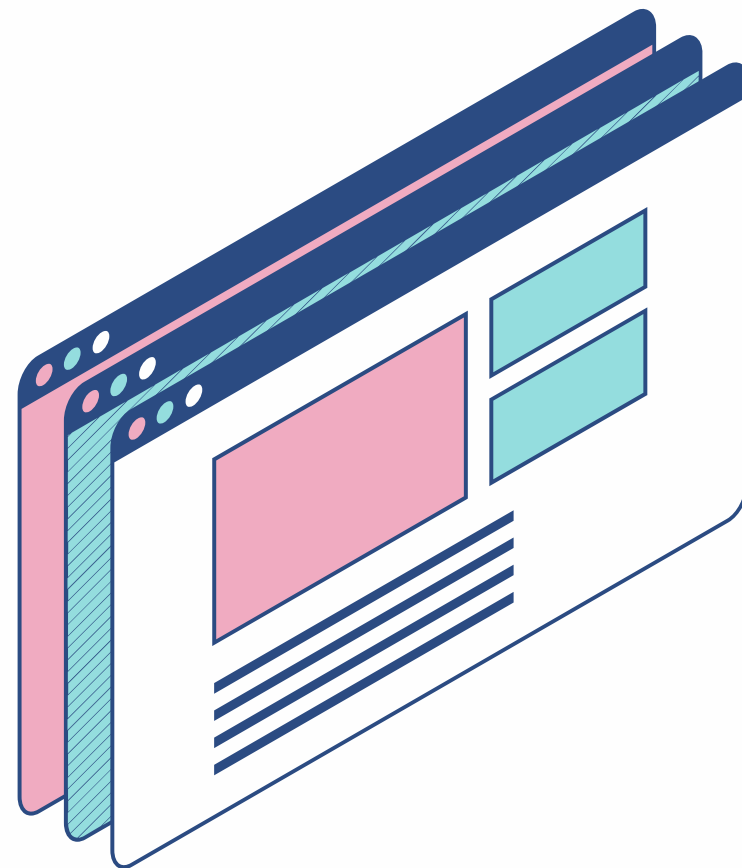

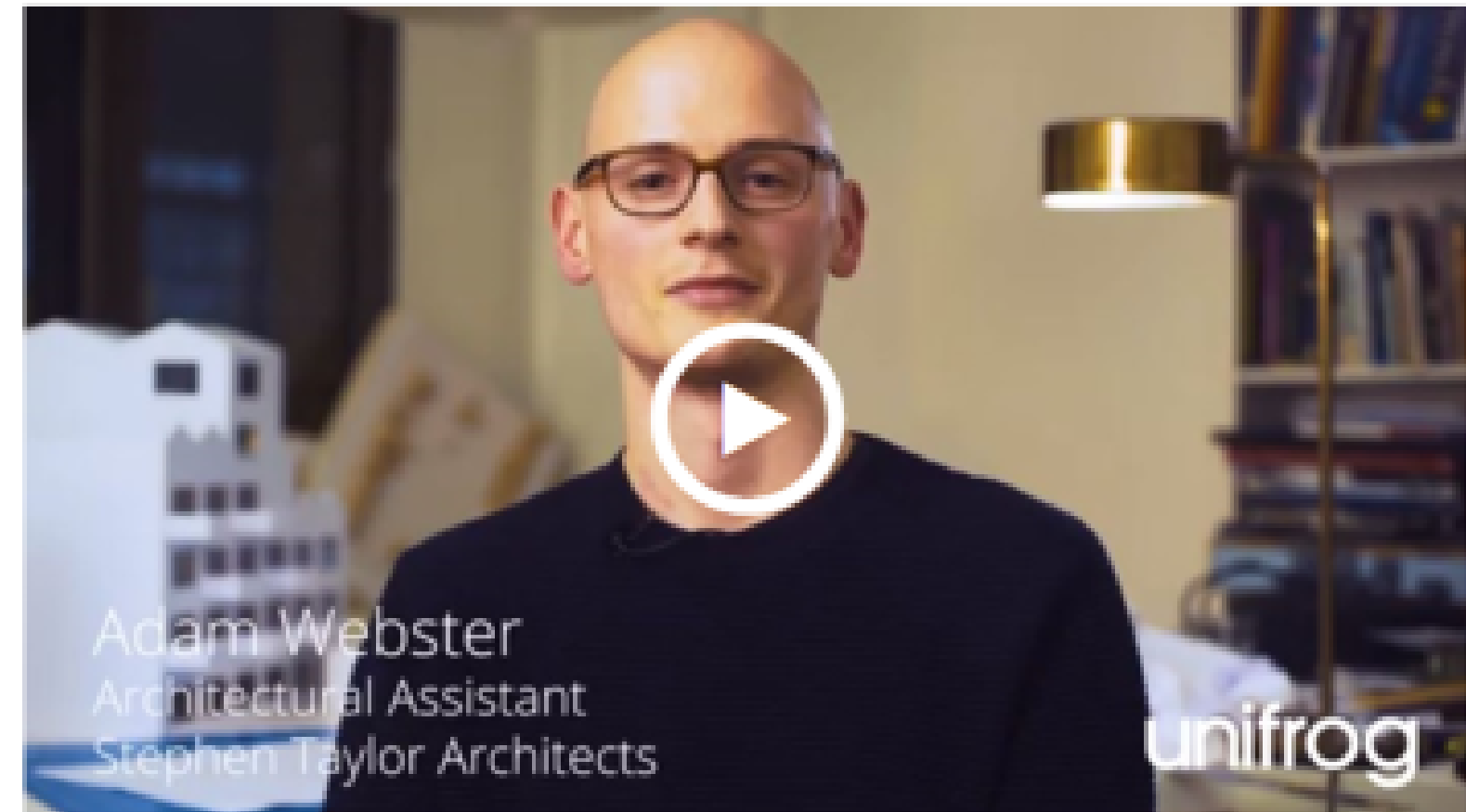

Architects design new buildings and the spaces around them, and work on the restoration and conservation of existing buildings.



Students must stay in school all day

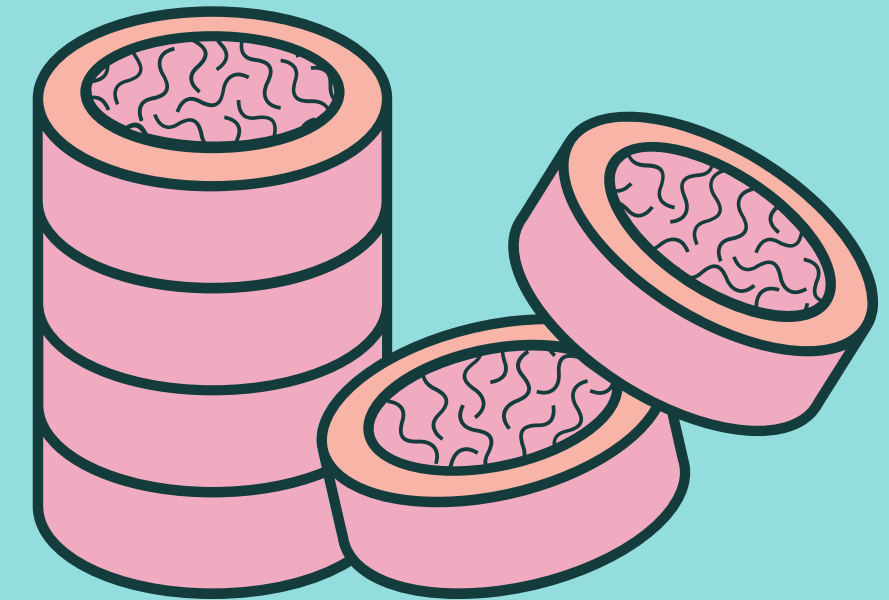
Between 8.40am-3.10pm, unless they have permission to leave the site for a medical appointment (agreed in advance), which will require signing out at Main Reception.

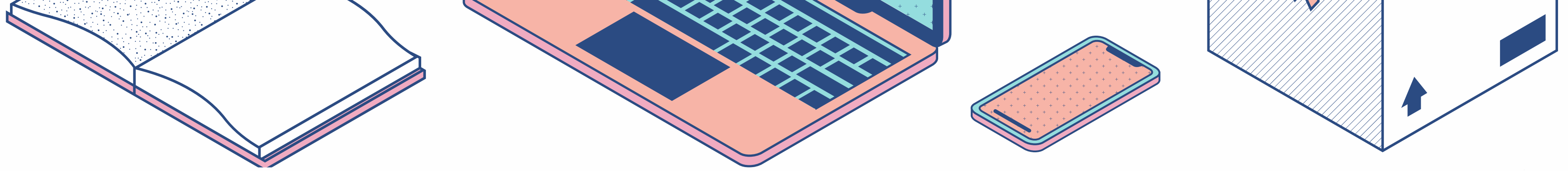

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The Sixth Form Fund

- We have sent a letter home to you regarding the Sixth Form Fund.
- Each student pays **£40** towards the cost of the extensive facilities that we provide for the exclusive use of the Sixth Form. It covers the whole of their time in the Sixth Form.
- This needs to be paid via your daughters' **sQuid account**





The Sixth Form Bursary

- The 16-19 Bursary is a limited fund made available for supporting eligible young people with the costs of transport, food, books, educational visits or other course materials or equipment essential to successfully completing their programme of study. You may be eligible if:
 - Your gross annual household income does not exceed £22,000 even if in receipt of working tax credit and/or;
 - You or a brother/sister, qualifies for Free School Meals (FSM), and/or;
 - Your family receives a certain type of income-based benefit:
 - Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
 - Income-related Employment & Support Allowance
 - Guarantee element of State Pension Credit

Mrs Bretherton will be sending out information about applying for a bursary next week, and it is also available on the website but please just go and speak to her in the Sixth Form QSA if you would like to find out more.

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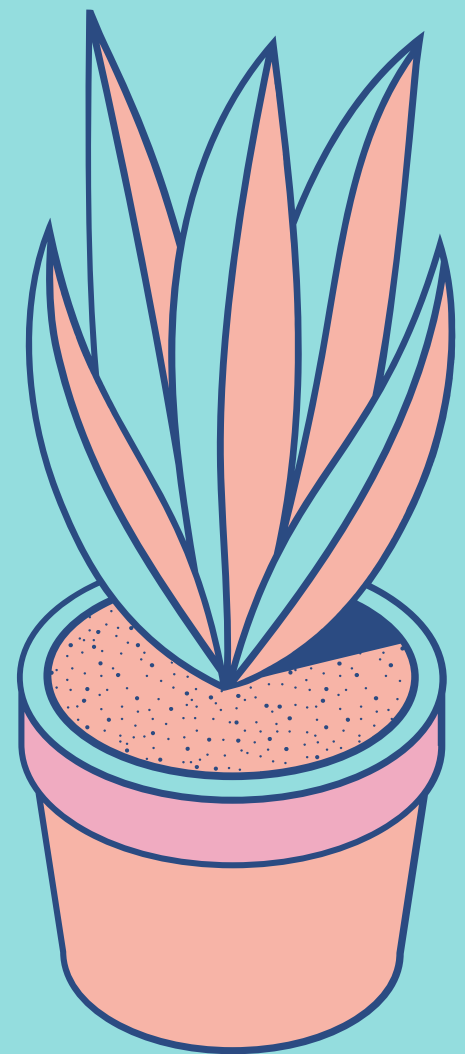
Uniform

Sixth Form students are encouraged to take **pride in their appearance** and must wear the Sixth Form uniform, which is appropriate for the **business environment**, as we believe that this is a student's place of work.

The Sixth Form uniform is a **tailored black skirt or trouser suit**, which is available to purchase from Goyals or School Direct. To make the uniform more affordable, students may purchase their black suit from a retailer of their choice, as long as it is suitable business wear. Students can wear a **top of their choice** and **appropriate footwear** (e.g. shoes not trainers).

The following do not comply with the Sixth Form dress code:

- Tops with large logos or writing on them
- Revealing or low-cut tops
- Hoodies or sweatshirts (even with school logo)
- Ugg style boots, Doc Martin style boots
- Trainers / canvas shoes or flip flops
- Facial piercings other than multiple small singular ear studs, as well as a small nose ring or stud
- Unnatural hair colour

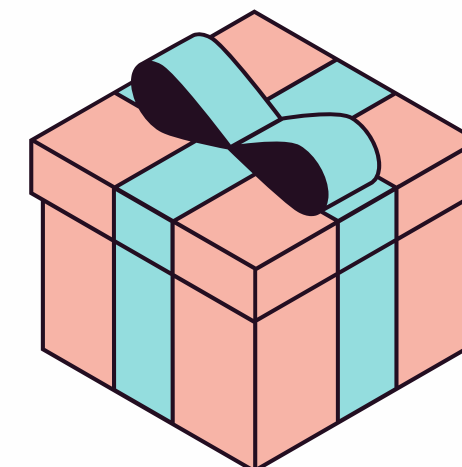
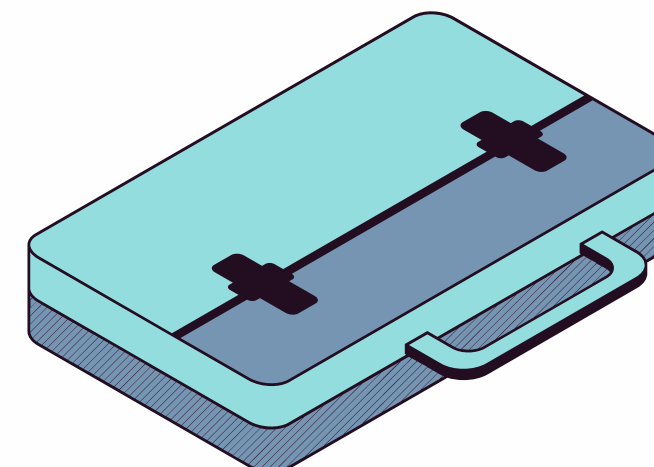
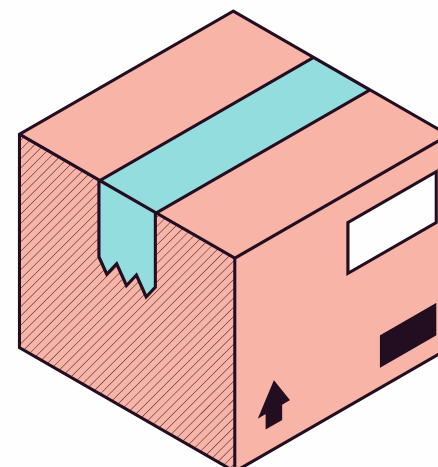
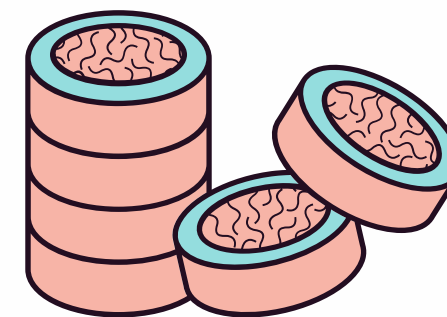
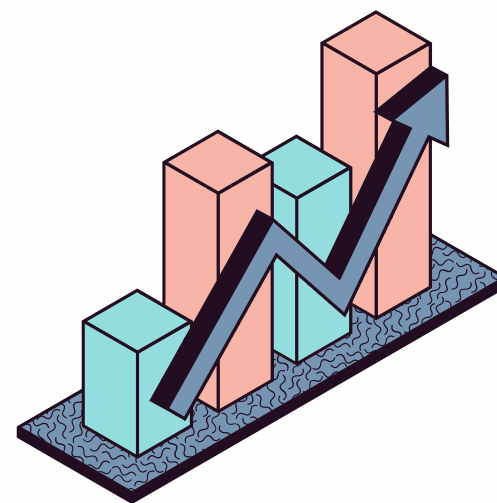
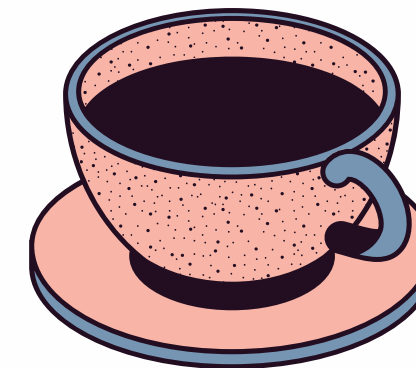
