#### Commitment




### **CAREERS**

Students go on to study a huge range of different subjects and pursue a wide variety of career paths. Our aim in the Sixth Form is to ensure that students have the tools and information they need to make the right decisions about which path they wish to follow.

Being part of the Sixth Form Bulletin Editorial Team has given me so much confidence, as well as enabling me to develop new skills.






#### **SCHOOL TRIPS**

Whether you decide to pursue science-based courses, the Arts, or a combination of both, there are opportunities throughout Sixth Form to participate in school trips to gain deeper insights into your subjects.

Sixth Form trips give students the chance to exercise their independence, whilst improving their understanding of important A-level subjects. As students prepare for the working world and learn about more complex topics, booking a Sixth Form trip can help your class strengthen their soft skills, in addition to giving them the knowledge to succeed in their exams.

As well as being a great opportunity to learn, school trips are also beneficial from a personal and social perspective. School trips can help students develop and strengthen their relationships with their peers. This is because they get to spend time together outside of their classrooms. As a result, students may become more confident at school and participate during lessons.

Our trip to Cern, Switzerland, translated our theoretical knowledge from the science laboratory into a real and tangible understanding of this major advance in the scientific world.





# EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION

The Extended Project Qualification is available to all students in Year 12 and forms an additional qualification to the subjects being studied. The EPQ allows each student to embark on a largely self-directed and self-motivated project. Students must choose a topic, plan, research and develop their idea and decide on the finished product. The EPQ is examined through AQA and is coordinated by Mrs Tor Wills.

We encourage creativity and curiosity. A project topic may be directly related to a student's main study programme, but should look beyond the specification. A finished product may take the form of a:

- Research based written report
- Production (eg; charity event, fashion show or sports event etc.)
- An artefact (eg; piece of art, a computer game or realised design)
- A written report must accompany these options.

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The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) has given me life-long skills which will be invaluable not only at university, but in any future career.

The research I've undertaken has enabled me to look in detail at a topic unrelated to my A-Levels but of personal interest to me. I've gained a huge amount of confidence and have loved every minute!



# BESPOKE SIXTH FORM CENTRE AND FACILITIES

In the Sixth Form, students enjoy much greater independence, preparing them for the self-directed study expected at university.

The modern Sixth Form Centre has a different feel from the rest of school. While you still have access to the fantastic wholeschool facilities including the swimming pool, science labs and the gym, you also gain the following:
